We arrived just after noon on the 6^{th} and immediately emptied our PW fridge and started preparing for the Meet and Greet later that afternoon. With the help of some of the other ladies we had things ready in no time. It was great that we had an oven to cook the chicken wings and the microwave to get the food ready. That evening members were catching up on what everyone did this summer and had some games going in the clubhouse.

The first two days were really hot and sunny, even too hot to play bocce ball and ladder golf (plus the mosquitoes were in full force). The next night we had a potluck with all kinds of choices for food. The Bulls and Dicksons - Heading to Enchant

On Sept 4th Jim & Maureen arrived at our place (Chilliwack BC) nice and early after staying at friends in Vancouver the night before. We were all ready and waiting and Geo went to start the PW and it was dead. He had started it the day before with no problem, but they ended up having to get a new battery and Jim, with better eyes than Geo, ended up installing it for us and we were on our way. After a short stop in Merritt we proceeded onwards hoping to make good time as we were now about two hours behind our scheduled leaving time. North of Kamloops a PW passed us and the occupants were waving away and we thought what friendly people PW owners are. Being as Maureen and I were operating walkie-talkies we were able to communicate. Maureen was sure it was the Tait's, one of our members who live in Vernon. Once we passed the Vernon exit and they didn't go off, I said it must be someone else. In Sorrento they did turn off, I guess hoping we would follow, but Geo had the peddle to the metal hoping to make up for lost time. We did later find out it was Bob and Barb Tait from Vernon BC. When they saw our 2 PW's they knew we were heading to the rally and wished they could have joined us. They have been to all the other events, but couldn't make this one. It is a confirmation that the folks we meet at these rallies and gatherings become life long friends and often travelling partners and you can bump into them in the strangest places.

We ended up staying the first night at the Lamplighter RV Park in Revelstoke. The next day we seemed to hit all the construction areas and had to wait in line-ups several times, but we made it to Mt Kidd RV Park in Kananaskis Park in Alberta. We didn't reserve ahead of time because we didn't know how far we would get. It was a Friday night and apparently everyone in Alberta decided to go camping that weekend. We were lucky to get a tent site each, which was still a big site, just no services. Our neighbours decided to spend the night visiting and we could hear them talking all night long. Hope we didn't wake them when we left. Kananaskis Park was where we lost our first rear hubcap. We went over a Texas Gate (cattle guard) a bit too fast and next thing we know Jim was on the 2-way radio yelling "hub cap! hub cap!" Fortunately Jim & Maureen were able to pin down the spot where it went sailing into the bushes and we were able to find it. It was damaged beyond repair. We stopped in High River AB to do some shopping for the rally and then on to Enchant along country roads.

The Bulls and Dicksons - Leaving Enchant

After the Rally Jim and Maureen of Victoria BC and George and myself had planned on heading South to Yellowstone NP but the snow and cold we encountered in Alberta was moving that direction so we decided to go back into BC and head south through Idaho and Utah to Bryce Canyon. Seemed like it might be warmer after that one cold day in Alberta, our BC blood just couldn't take it. Jeff and Hilary Shardelow of West Kelowna BC were also heading west to go home so we said we might meet them in Cranbrook. We did some shopping in Pincher Creek and had lunch there and then stopped in Sparwood and who do we see walking across the lawn, but Jeff..... they had arrived there just before us. Being as we left when they were still packing up, we had a chuckle over that.

We departed Sparwood leaving them to look around the town. We pulled into a campground in Cranbrook and when we got out to register Jeff and Hilary drove in behind us. The Shardelow's and the Bull's got a nice spot in the tent area, but the Dickson's couldn't camp there as dogs were not allowed, so they had to camp up on the hill. We stayed one night in Cranbrook and then crossed the border to the USA. We went through the border with no problem, but Jim and Maureen had their PW thoroughly checked over as the border guards were concerned about what ingredients were in the dog food. They had to discard all the seeds from a tomato that I had given them from my garden, plus that little bit of

lemon that was hiding in the fridge. Do you know you can get a fine of \$300 for not having declared having such a thing at the border.

The first night in the USA we stayed at the Clearwater River Casino in Lewiston Idaho. Had a nice meal there and stayed in the parking lot. We found out in the morning there was a campground on the other side of the Casino. It looked lovely, lots of grass and even had a pool. Even though the guys went in and asked if we could camp in the parking lot, no one mentioned their RV Park on the other side. Oh well it was a free night. The next night was one of the best and cheapest of the trip at Hi Valley RV Park in Boise, ID. The sites were big and level and well gravelled with a concrete area beside the site with a grassed area also. If you are travelling with a dog, this is the place for you. They have a nice fenced in area for your pet to get his exercise. Nice washrooms and showers and a clean laundry room, all for \$23.76. (AAA discount). Check them out at: www.grapevine7.com

We visited Bryce Canyon National Park and toured around that area for the day. Bryce Canyon was beautiful. We parked our PW and we went in for one fare with Jim driving. At the National Park campground there were only spots in the sand remaining so we continued on to Hatch to spend the night at a forgettable RV park.

After Bryce we headed West through scenic canyons and mountain passes. Some of the scenic roads we took were twisting and turning, up and down, some cliffs that were pretty high with no guardrails. It was a real exercise of the arms for the drivers. We drove the Loneliest Highway #50 through Nevada. It was straight and flat and later on some real interesting scenery. We saw one lonely man walking with his shopping buggy heading west. He didn't appear to want a ride and have no idea where he would have found food or a place to stay along that road. This where the 2nd rear hub cap flew off. George, again driving in the lead, drove onto the rumble strip that divides the lanes and it was rough enough to send his other rear hub cap off into the desert. Again, sharp eyed Dicksons behind us stopped and we were able to recover it. It also was damaged beyond repair. *Warning!! be sure your hub caps are secure!!*

We went west as far as the Pacific Ocean and, again, thinking others had given up camping for the year, arrived at Harris State Park in Brookings, Oregon to a full campground. We were able to get two nice flat tent sites with no services. On we went to check out the Myrtle Wood Factory in Coos Bay. In Lincoln City we were going to treat ourselves to the Prestige RV Park but it was full. The park owner was nice enough to call other RV parks and on the fourth try we got a spot at the KOA. That was all that was available in Lincoln City. We missed the Outlet Mall in Lincoln City but went on to buy cheese at the cheese factory in Tillamook. We had lunch at Seaside and then Jim & Maureen headed over to I-5 so Maureen could do some shopping at the Seattle Premium Outlet Stores north of Seattle. We wanted to avoid I-5 so continued north through Astoria and took the ferry at Port Townsend and on to Oak Harbour to camp for the night. The next morning we headed home. We put on 5990 km's while Jim & Maureen put on 6477 km's or 4025 miles and got 16 mpg on the trip.
